Anaerobic and Sludge Processes (ASP)

A forum to advance the basics of the Microbiology and Biochemistry of the anaerobic digestion processes, the advances in plant technology, and to overcome the problems associated with anaerobic digestion

Community Water Supply and Sanitation (CWSS)

Water Distribution

A center of expertise for all aspects of the management and control of water distribution systems; including network analyses, leak control, corrosion, pipe deterioration, metering data logging materials and fittings and the creation and maintenance of databanks.

Water Innovations

To support the optimisation of water innovation value chains through the continued development and regular engagement of a community of practice in water technology innovation.

Water Reuse

Water recycling and reuse makes it possible to produce 'new water' for cities, towns and industries, and at the same time reduces wastewater discharge to the environment.

As Southern Africa is an arid region, the reuse of water has become critically important to ensure sustainable growth and development in the country, thereby improving quality of life. Current challenges relate to technical, economic, social, institutional and regulatory aspects of water reuse.

Water Science

A forum to promote the improvement in the standard of operations, the training and status of Watercare personnel, and to enhance the communications between members

A center of expertise in the water field for chemical and bacteriological analysis and methods; effluent standards; plant operation; legislation and law enforcement; training of water scientists; and the role of water scientists in the design of water and wastewater treatment plants

Young Water Professionals (YWP)

The YWP's aim is to connect people in order to provide opportunities for YWP's to meet and communicate, provide career development opportunities for YWP's through the organisation of workshops and online initiatives, offer sector support to help employers with the recruitment and retention of YWP's. Work on programme development to ensure that the programme remains relevant to the needs of YWP's and provide for engagement of young water professionals in IWA and WISA programmes and other water related initiatives.
